The “first impression” of the campus for prospective students and many visitors, Lewis Hall reopened as the home of the University’s Office of Admissions in the Fall of 2004. Supporting several programs, including student orientation and campus tours, Lewis Hall’s perfect location on Sweetheart Circle showcases an elegantly refurbished structure in the heart of the University’s historic district. With nearly 25,000 square feet on two levels, Lewis Hall’s amenities include a stunning wood-paneled lobby, presentation room, conference rooms and administrative offices.

An old postcard discovered during the renovation of the building offered some historical insight into Lewis Hall’s previous life in the campus community. Constructed as a junior women’s residence hall in 1937, Lewis Hall was named for Samuel Wister Lewis, a Statesboro automobile dealer, banker and member of the Board of Trustees of the college.
